PUBLIC CONSULTATION: PROPOSED EASTERN CPZ EXTENSION - WORTHING

West Sussex County Council is writing to residents and businesses to seek opinions on the possibility of introducing Controlled Parking Zone (CPZ) restrictions in your area.

In partnership with Worthing Borough Council, the County Council is seeking to establish the level of support for tacking forward CPZ proposals in your area, as shown on the enclosed plan. Your initial views on parking problems in your area were taken into account when residents and businesses were given the opportunity to complete and return a questionnaire during the summer of 2010. The results of this survey along with the results of a street level vehicle occupancy survey were analysed and showed a possible need/desire for new CPZ restrictions.

Enclosed with this letter is a plan of the proposed Eastern CPZ area, a comment card and a pre-paid envelope which can be used to send your comments about the proposals to us here at the County Council. Your views on this first set of proposals are important to us.

You are also invited to attend a **Public Consultation Exhibition** taking place near to you. There you can discuss the proposals for your area in detail with County Council officers and register your views. It will be taking place as follows:

**East Worthing Community Centre, Pages Lane, BN11 2NQ on 24th March 2011,
between the times of 1.00pm and 7.00pm.**

If you cannot attend this exhibition you can still see the proposals for all areas and register your comments at:

**Worthing Central Library, Richmond Road, BN11 1HD on Saturday 26th March 2011,
between the times of 10.00am and 4.00pm.**

It is important to note that at the moment, no decisions on whether/how to proceed have been made. All comments received during this consultation will be reported to County Councillors at the end of April. If supported/approved, a further statutory consultation will take place in early summer and residents and businesses will have another opportunity to comment.
